Degree Show '13 Institute of Precious Metals

Institute of Precious Metals is a 3-year course in contemporary jewelry art / design – only in Denmark. The purpose of the program at the Institute of Precious Metals is the development of the personal, artistic expression in the jewelry design. The study is experimental, and the artistic process is focused.

- Jewelry that rocks by the incumbent.
- Jewelry that push the limits of our understanding and performances.
- Objects that are beyond the scope of what we traditionally associate with the concept of jewelry.
